One of the main goals of Watershed has been to celebrate and support forms of music theatre not traditionally given centre stage - to shine a light on the great work being done out there to bring new voices to the theatre and create new audiences to hear those voices. Watershed 2024 celebrates Neurodiversity and Disability Arts and we are thrilled to be partnering with Kingston's own H'art Centre, a leader in neurodiverse and disability arts creation to create a HAPPY, a new music theatre work which will premiere at the Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts on April 20, 2024.
