The DAN School of Drama and Music at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in DRAM 439. This is an in-person teaching, upper-year practicum capstone course with an expected enrolment of 15 students. Candidates should have a PhD, and teaching experience at the university level in Theatre Studies or a related discipline. This is a Fall/Winter term appointment for the period 1-Sep-25 to 30-Apr-26, with classes in session from 2-Sep to 6-Apr-26.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons.
