Responsibilities

- Assist with grading using the onQ tools
- Communicate with students to answer course-related questions
- Provide feedback on assignments
- Manage accommodations through Ventus
- Coordinate with course instructor

Requirements

General knowledge of Western popular music history from the late 19th century to the present; familiarity with OnQ and its assessment tools; ability to communicate well with students and provide assessment feedback; and ability to manage student accommodations through Ventus and coordinate effectively with course instructor.

Contract hours and rate of Pay

The hours in the TA contract will be determined based on the actual course enrolment. Current enrollment would indicate that the contract hours would be 130 hours over the summer term. Graduate Teaching Assistants at Queen's University are governed by the Collective Agreement for Teaching Assistants and Teaching Fellows between [PSAC Local 901](#) and Queen's University. Remuneration will be in accordance with the Collective Agreement, and appointments are subject to funding or enrolment criteria.
