Course Description: MUSC 240 Music of Video Games Units: 3.00

An examination of the music of video games, focusing on sociological perspectives of gameplay. Content will include game history, theories of play, immersion and interactivity, interactions with social media and other online communities, and related interdisciplinary topics such as trope, intertextuality, and narrative.

Required Knowledge: Extensive written knowledge required to mark essays and other written assignments; Ability to respond to emails in a professional and timely manner; At minimum, a basic knowledge of music concepts and of video gaming is required (candidates with a strong knowledge of one area but a weaker knowledge of the other are still welcome to apply).

The hours in the TA contract will be determined based on the actual course enrolment. Past enrollments would indicate that there will be one position with contract hours would be 65 hours for the Fall term.
